
### Rotary Club Young Chef of the Year 2023 Competition

"Dear Sir/Madam,

I am emailing you to express my thanks to some lovely students, who helped my niece yesterday when she fell over across the road from the Millers Pond pub.

My niece has autism and other learning needs, she was running to try and catch the bus but unfortunately fell over and really hurt herself. There was a group of year 10 pupils (lads and girls) that were walking home from school and 4 of the lads came rushing down to make sure that she was ok as she was in a right mess and helped her back on her feet. One of the girls asked if she wanted her to ring anyone to come and get her as they didn't want to just leave her there. One of the lads insisted, that they weren't going anywhere until her dad come to collect her and 2 of the girls helped her in the car along with another girl carrying her belongings to the car.

I just want to say a huge thank you to those pupils for not only helping my niece out when she fell over, but also staying with her until her father come and got her. She and I are grateful for the help, her parents are as well. These pupils as well the staff in the school should be very proud of themselves for being so kind towards my niece. She is doing ok and luckily there are not broken bones but a few cuts and bruises."
